

My Reports

There are several types of reports and formats for them that you can get from your epilepsy diary. You can view them in the browser window or you can print them to show them to your doctor and other health care professionals (to help him/her help you come up with the best treatment plan possible). The types of reports you can get in the diary are:

- Diary Reports
- Display Graphs
- Medicine Organizer
- My Notes

Diary Reports

How do I create my reports?

1. Go to **My Reports**.
2. Click on the name of the type of report you would like to view or print.

How can I change the date range for my report?

1. Select a report start date using the drop down menus for the month/day/year.
2. Select a report end date using the drop down menus for the month/day/year.
3. Click the **Go** button. The report will refresh using the new dates.

How can I display just my Diary Data?

To view just Diary Data (see Figure 68 above):


1. Click on the checkbox next to Display Diary Data.
2. Select the dates of the data you want to view.
3. Click the **GO** button.

How can I display just my Medical History?

To view just my Medical History (see Figure 68 above):

1. Click on only the checkbox next to Display Medical History.
2. Select the dates of the data you want to view.
3. Click the **GO** button.

How can I print Reports?

When you click the  button for any of the 4 Report choices, a new window will open up with the report you requested. It will be in a format that is printer-friendly so that you can have a nicely formatted report to view or to give to your doctor on your next visit. This page should automatically bring up the print option in your browser so that you can make sure that the correct printer is selected. Just click **Print**.

Diary Reports

The Diary Reports is the default page under **My Reports**. It contains an overview of all of your seizure, medicine, and side effect information as well as your medical history. You will have to select the report and the time period that you want to print. ([See steps above on creating reports.](#))

Display Graphs

The Display Graphs of reports gives you a way to look at what your seizures, medicine, and side effect activity has been for a specific period of time. You can actually select the items you would like displayed as a colorful bar graph. However, each time you change the items checked you will need to click the **GO** button to update the graph image.

When you create a graph you can select the dates you want to see. Then if you select your seizures you can see over a specific time how often they happen. If you have selected more than one seizure type you can see how they compare to each other. If you include **Missed medicines** in your report, you might even be able to see if missing a medicine could be what is

causing some seizure activity -- if you have a seizure each time you miss a medicine. The same kind of activity can be mapped or graphed out with when you start or discontinue a medicine. There are many combinations of reports you can do to look for patterns that will help you and your doctor to modify your treatment to improve managing your condition.

Can I change the type of graph I'm getting?

No, but several are automatically generated for you. You get a:

- Seizure bar chart
- Side effects bar chart
- Medication level chart
- Seizure distribution pie chart

Here are examples of each chart.

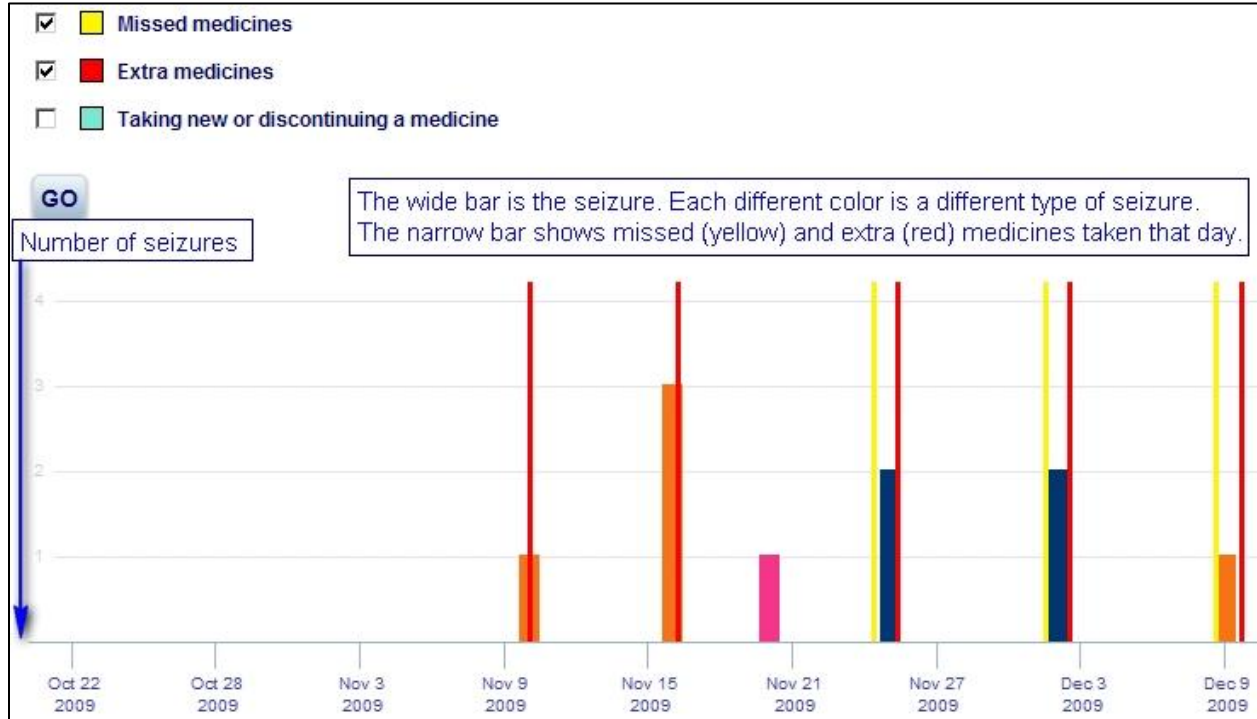


Figure 70. Seizure bar graph

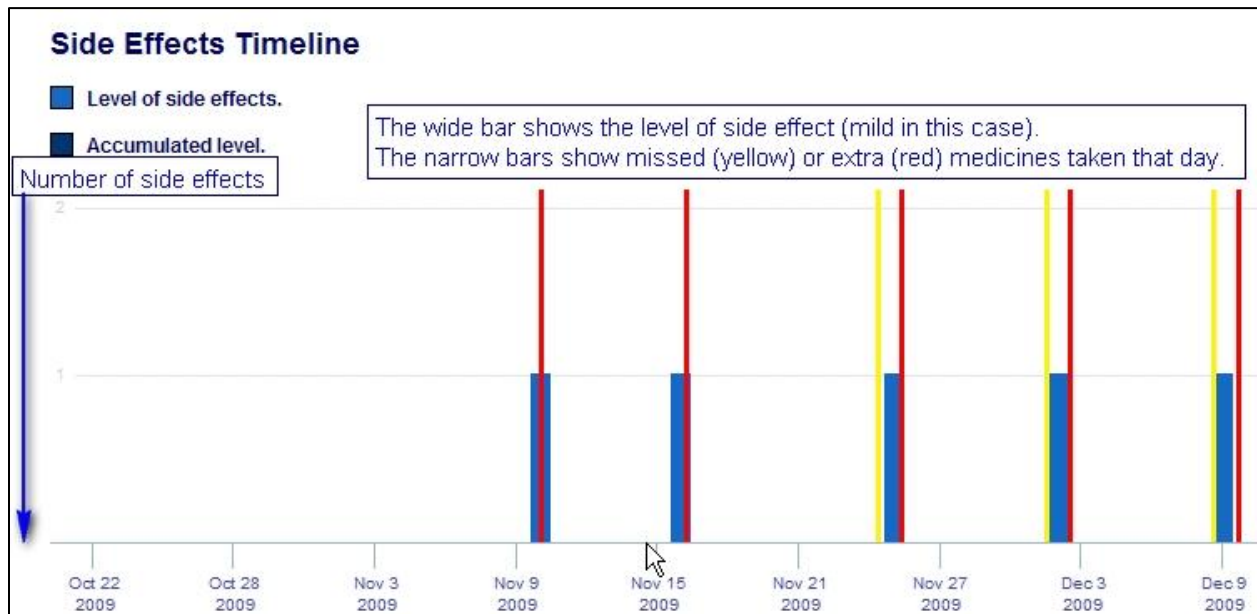


Figure 71. Side Effects Timeline bar graph

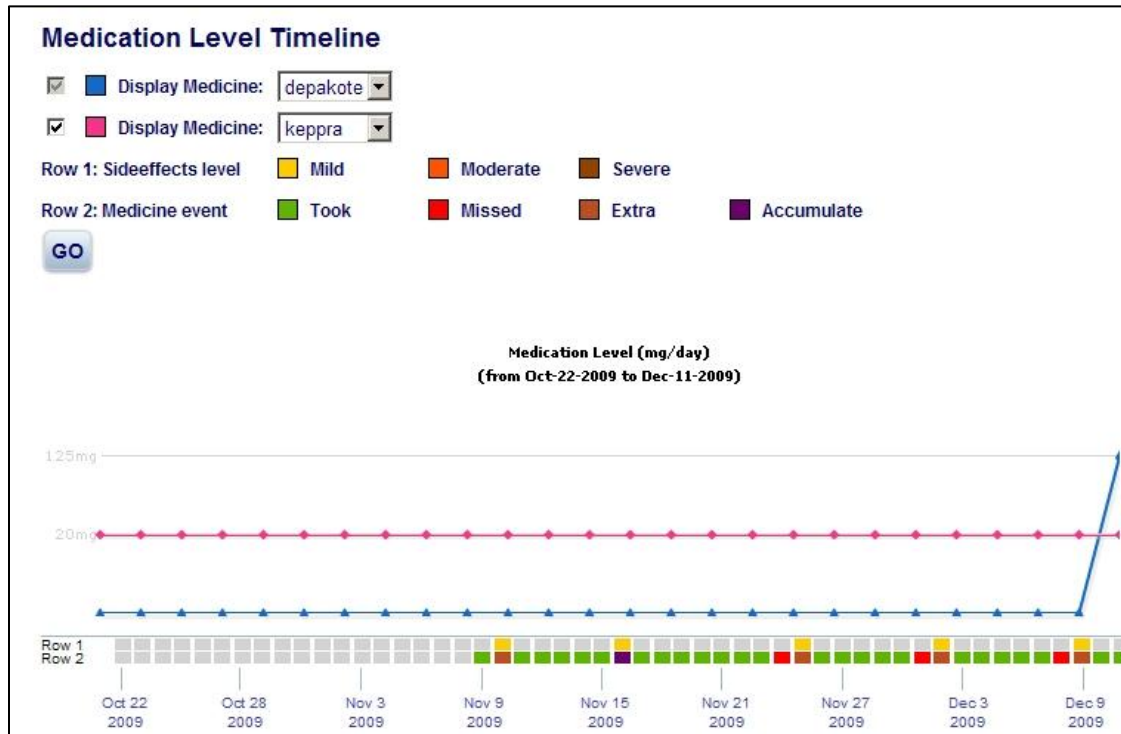


Figure 72. Medication Level Timeline bar graph

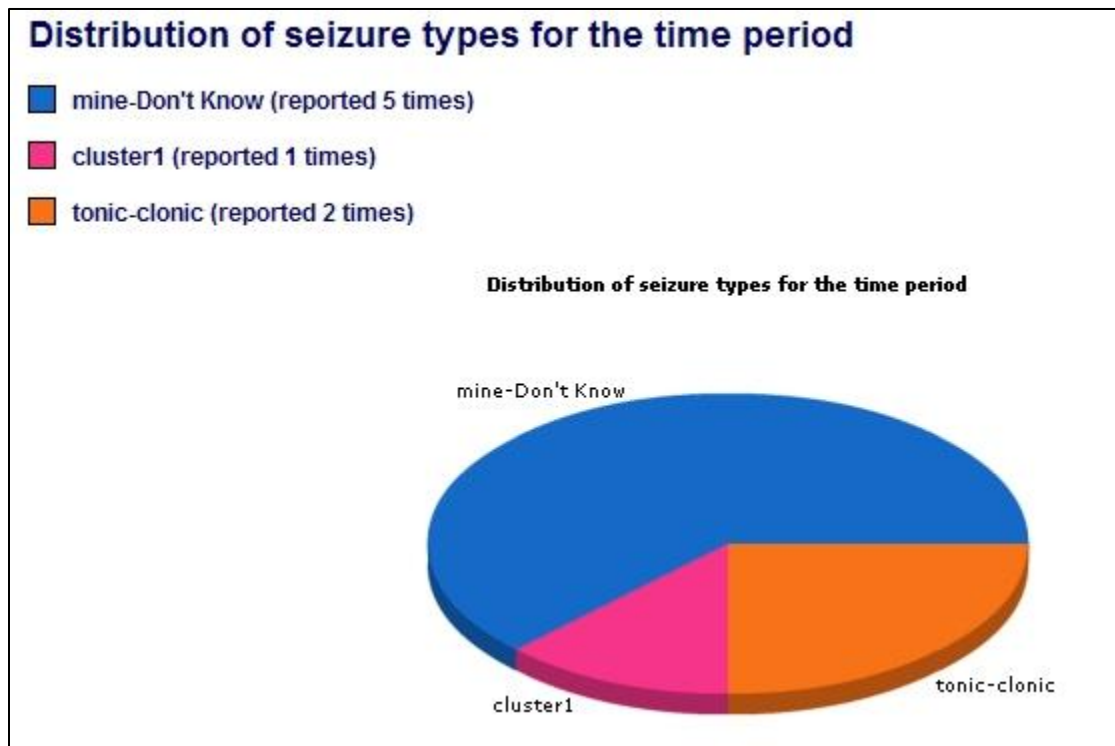


Figure 73. Distribution of seizure types

Medicines Organizer

The Medicines Organizer is a summary of all the information in your profile about the medicines, vitamins, and supplements that you are taking. It provides a summary of all the important information about these items in one place. (See an example in Figure 74.) Definitely a must have to take along to your next doctor's appointment.

My Notes are exactly what they sound like. This page or report shows you any notes you made to yourself in your diary during the date range you have selected. Like the other reports, you can select the beginning and ending date that you wish to see notes from and they will display. You can print your notes by clicking on the Print button. A new window or tab will open and you will see something like the image below that is ready to print.

What is an extension?

A browser extension is an add-on that places an icon directly into your browser to allow you one-click access to a webpage or application. Adding the extension for your browser will let you click on it and go directly to the diary login page without having to log into the website. If you have checked the Remember me and Save my password boxes on the login page, clicking on this icon will take you directly into your diary so that you can start entering information or looking at it immediately.
