Position Summary

The Epilepsy Foundation’s Multicultural Outreach and Education team is seeking a motivated Public Health Intern to support outreach and education initiatives focused on reducing epilepsy disparities among diverse communities. The intern will gain experience in public health communication, community engagement, and health equity research, working alongside Foundation staff to promote awareness and access to epilepsy education within multicultural audiences.

Key Responsibilities

- Research and analyze epilepsy disparities among racial, ethnic, and marginalized populations.
 - Support the development of educational brochures, digital content, and community resources targeting diverse audiences.
 - Assist with outreach to HBCUs, MSIs, and Tribal Colleges to promote Seizure First Aid training and the Epilepsy Learning Portal.
 - Participate in the promotion of Community Health Worker (CHW) programs and other educational initiatives.
 - Support planning and execution of virtual events and webinars addressing health equity and epilepsy awareness.
 - Assist with literature reviews, scholarly article preparation, and manuscript writing for public health publications or conferences.
 - Demonstrate professionalism, ethical technology use, and cultural humility in all work and communications.
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Learning Objectives

By the end of the internship, the intern will:

- Strengthen research and analytical skills by exploring public health disparities.
 - Enhance health communication and outreach abilities by developing and promoting culturally responsive materials.
 - Gain exposure to program design and community health engagement through event planning and education initiatives.
 - Improve policy and advocacy insight through review and discussion of laws addressing epilepsy disparities.
 - Build professional writing and presentation skills through support of scholarly articles and reports.
